A brilliant scholar who spoke 17 languages and a close friend of the Beat Poets, Ansen was perhaps best known as the model for some of the most flamboyant characters in Beat fiction - Rollo Greb in Kerouac's On the Road, AJ in Burroughs' Naked Lunch and Dad Deform in Corso's American Express.

"Love is in The Air" measures 13 x 19.5 inches and is black spraypaint on irregular shaped white gloss paper. "Bombing Middle England" is present without the bomb section and measures 15.5 x 16 inches, black spraypaint on irregular shaped white gloss paper. "Weston Super Mare" consists of three pieces and is present in two states, the first measuring 16 x 19 inches is of a figure sitting on bench, black spraypaint on irregular white gloss paper and with the cane cut out. This is heavily worked by the artist in black pen and whiteout to add definition. The second state is the now amended image of the man on the bench, without the cane cut out. Black spraypaint of irregular shaped white gloss paper measuring 19.5 x 12.5 inches. The third piece is the saw portion. Black spraypaint on white irregular shaped gloss paper measuring 12 x 23 inches. As is essential with all BANKSY work, full documented provenance and Pest Control certification is included. £125,000

A highly important group of original paintings documenting the artist's transition from street-based guerilla artist to gallery sensation. Requested by and loaned to the artist for his highly acclaimed Bristol Museum Exhibition in 2009.
